
Regional work towards resilience





Resilient East coordination and initiatives are jointly funded by the eight partner councils and the Green Adelaide Board. We secured funding for a Coordinator in 2022-23 as a partnership funding agreement.

Resilient East councils are located on the Adelaide Plains, the traditional lands of the Kaurna people. We acknowledge this land as the traditional lands for the Kaurna people and we respect their spiritual relationship with their country. We also acknowledge the Kaurna people as the custodians of the Adelaide region and their cultural and heritage beliefs are still as important to the living Kaurna people today.




Climate Ready Homes


